Te hope you're enjoying Summer! In this edition of the Meadowlark, the Board is going to share information about the Homeowners Association's expenses.

The HOA's expenses are pretty straightforward. This is a general overview of the annual expenses – in 2022 the budget was for \$115,447 in expenses.

- Operational Expenses \$67,275 / year
 - Landscaping Maintenance Mowing / Maintenance Contract ~\$43,000
 - Landscaping Needs Mainly Trees / Improvements ~ \$19,000
 - Other Miscellaneous Expenses -\$5,275
- General and Administrative Expenses \$48,172
 - RealManage Contract / Administrative Expenses ~\$37,000
 - o Insurance ~\$5,000
 - Homeowner Activities / Holiday Lighting \$9,000

The Reserve Study suggested a \$19,400 contribution in 2022, with that amount increasing annually by \sim \$400-\$500.

With income of \$121,800 from dues and 2022 expenses of \$115,447, that left about \$6,350 for the reserve fund contribution as opposed to the \$19,400 suggested. There is a shortfall between income and expenses that will only increase as annual costs for services increase and additional fence maintenance expenses increase. As everyone knows, costs are increasing for everyone, including your HOA.

One note, there are unexpended funds that built up over several years in the HOA's accounts – the Board used some of those funds for the recent tree removals and is planning on using the remainder for the tree replacement / landscaping needs in 2022 and possibly 2023.





y the time you read this article, it will be July, and you may be thinking it is too late to do any landscaping or gardening! I am here to reassure you that you still have time. Our first fall frost date is about mid-October for our area.

I encourage people to make a simple sketch of your property with existing flower beds and hardscape you already have. If a drone was overhead, what would it see? Mark your home, any trees and bushes, the patio etc. Now mark a little compass showing the north and south directions as well. This can be fun for kids to draw




and color as well. Let them dream and plan what they want to plant and what they would like to eat!

Now walk around

your property and identify any bare spots where you could add some plants, or a small-raised bed for a vegetable garden. You will need some good southern exposure for most veggies to thrive. Ideally a minimum of 6 hours of full sun is best for your vegetable garden. A salsa garden is a nice idea that has been popular with many. Ask your kids what they want to grow and see if there is enough time to grow these plants to maturity. Small metal or wood raised beds are available online for them to get started.

You can even start some plants from seeds, especially vegetables. Look at the back of the seed packet. How many days does it take to germinate? Then add in the days to maturity. If the total is under 100 days, then you are good. I am looking at a packet of bush beans and it says 58 days to maturity, and it takes 6-12



If you are looking to add something different to your landscape, then I have a few ideas to share. Sweet alyssum can be a nice ground cover and has plenty of tiny flowers. They can self-seed and come back in the garden the next year. If you have a shady area, kind of a woodland area then woodruff is a nice ground cover and ajuga is also another one to consider. Beebalm is another nice plant that flowers and can slowly multiply over a few seasons.

If you are looking for something for your pots, nasturtiums can be planted outdoors directly from seed. I usually soak them overnight or clip the edge of the large seed with a nail clipper to help in germination. Plant the seed in nice loose fertile soil. The plant has edible flowers and leaves. It makes a great conversation piece as guests marvel at the idea of edible flowers. The flowers can be frozen into ice cubes and used in your lemonade. The leaves are peppery in flavor and have an interesting shape. These can be used in sandwiches and salads!

If you want a pollinator garden, here are some resources to help you in planning a pollinator strip in your yard - https://extension.illinois.edu/ and https://www.chicagobotanic.org/ plantinfo/smartgardener has some very good information that is relevant for our specific area.



This year I am experimenting with dwarf varieties of sunflowers which can be a fun project for gardeners of all ages. This can be planted in a 1 ft. deep pot and make sure it has drainage holes. Add some rich potting soil and plant the seed according to directions. Cover with soil and water gently. Lilliput zinnias and calendula are a few others that I think add beautiful color and I find satisfying to grow!

I hope this gives you a few ideas of what you can still plant in the garden and a few resources you can go to. Enjoying your outdoor space can be so much fun and hopefully you get a tasty snack out of it too!

NEW CONSTRUCTION OF DECKS AND PATIOS

If you are planning on constructing a new deck or patio on your property this season, a reminder that you must submit an ARC form with the Homeowners Association and obtain proper permits, if necessary.

PARKWAY TREES

Remember that the care and trimming of the parkway trees is the homeowner's responsibility.

SUMMER LANDSCAPING REMINDERS

- Lawn sprinkler watering is allowed from 6 to 10 am and 6 to 10 pm on even and odd days based on your street number address.
- Height of grass and weeds may not exceed 8 inches.
- Yard waste paper bags should be stored in your garage and put out for disposal on the evening before residential trash pickup, which is Friday for High Meadow.
- Sidewalks should be clear of overgrown bushes and tree branches by property owners to allow for safe passage.
- Sweep sidewalks after applying granular fertilizer.
- Pick up dog waste when walking pets around the subdivision.

Violations may result in enforcement by the board of directors and/or Naperville Code Enforcement.




