T's hard to believe we are nearing the end of summer and school will be starting up again soon. I hope you can all fit in a few more fun summer activities while enjoying the heautiful weather.

I will soon be leaving my HOA Board position as my husband and I will be moving out of the area. It's been a pleasure serving our beautiful River Run community over the past four years. If you're interested in joining the River Run HOA Board, please contact one of the current board members. It's a wonderful opportunity to give back and meet more of your fabulous neighbors.

Naperville An Award-Winning Community - In case you missed the great news, Naperville was listed for the second year in a row as Number 1 in two community rankings compiled by Niche: Best Cities to Raise a Family in America and Best Public Schools in America. As River Run residents, we also have the privilege of living in a beautiful and friendly neighborhood within Naperville.

Festive Entrances - A big thank you goes out to Mary Schmidt for adding a patriotic flair to our entrances for the Fourth of July holiday!

Berm Improvements - The River Run Board conducted its annual berm walk to review the health and completeness of our bordering landscape. Joined by our arborist and landscape lead, we found that our past investments in tree/shrub treatments and replacements (especially the Austrian pines) are paying off. To help recent plantings to thrive in the dry weather, gator bags will be installed which allow for continuous watering and easy refills. Shrubs and trees that are not thriving will be replaced this fall.

Monument Lighting - Repairs to the monument lighting at all our entrances have been completed. The 25-year-old light fixtures have been replaced with updated and more efficient LED lighting.

Lawn Upkeep - The City of Naperville ordinance requires grass and weeds to be maintained at an appropriate height (not to exceed 8 inches). Violations can be reported to the Naperville Code Enforcement group at ce@naperville.il.us.

New Homeowners - We welcome our new homeowners to River Run! During your closing

process, you should have received our River Run bylaws and architectural standards. In case you did not, these key documents can be found at RealManage.com. Please review these documents before starting any external projects on your home (such as exterior painting, roofs, decks, fences, pools, etc.). It would be a shame to start investing in a project only to find out that it doesn't align with our River Run architectural standards. If a homeowner starts a project prior to having HOA approval, they will receive a fine and will be required to stop until approval is received. If you have any questions, feel free to contact our Property Management company RealManage or an HOA Board member.

Dear Valued Member,

hope you are all having a great summer. We are seeing a record number of members and their guests using and renting our facilities and taking advantage of all of the amenities our club has to offer.

The Memorial Day and July 4th events drew nearly 800 members and guests over those two weekend events. Due to the numbers attending on Memorial Day, we had to reserve a second food truck to ensure great service. I give credit to our General Manager, Kerry, on the exceptional job she is doing in planning these and keeping the facility looking great. The tennis lessons, pickleball play, sand volleyball, swim and water polo teams, even after necessary adjustments, continue to draw member participation and attract potential new members. The kid's camp hosted by KE Camps has been a great new member amenity this year and will look to continue that next season as well as the chess club we just recently introduced. We are also rolling out a key-fob entry system to facilitate early morning use of the club.

We review our budget and financials regularly and the good news is that we are on track with our projected budget for the year and are ahead with some revenue numbers, driven from facility rentals and additional new annual members. While we continue to see operational costs rise and more repairs needed for our club, our focused attention on expense control and revenue growth are taking effect. We want to continue to invest in the club long term for the betterment of our members.

We are closely reviewing our capital plan for FY2023, as we may need to pull forward some larger projects related to our outdoor pool, including the pool filter and chemical control units, all of which are original equipment.

Moon · | Female · | 1 Year Old | Adoption Fee \$75



Tith all the hot, dry weather we've been having this summer, these drought-tolerant plants will be a welcome addition to your garden. Once established, these plants will need less water and will add color and texture to your gardens in spring, summer and fall. We've picked out six of our favorite plants that thrive in dry conditions.



AGASTACHE OR HUMMINGBIRD MINT

An exceptional group of plants that are known for their profuse, long lasting showy spikes of blooms that attract both hummingbirds and butterflies. Their foliage and blooms are fragrant, being very reminiscent of anise candy.

Drought and heat tolerant, they are best planted in sunny south or west facing slopes in lean, well drained soils. Agastaches must have excellent drainage, so do not plant near a wet area or water with a sprinkler system. To improve winter hardiness leave the stems intact. Remove old stems just above the new foliage in the spring.



ASCLEPIAS TUBEROSA OR BUTTERFLY WEED

This is considered to be the most garden worthy of our native milkweeds. Very showy, brilliant orange-red flowers are excellent for cutting and very attractive to bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. The seed pods are used in dried

arrangements. It emerges late in spring, so be patient. The long tap root makes division difficult, but it will happily reseed. Do not prune it in the fall, but cut it back in the spring. A perfect plant for dry areas in the garden.

GAILLARDIA OR BLANKET FLOWER

Gaillardia get their common name 'blanket flower' from the way they used to blanket the prairie. They are one of the longest



blooming perennials. The brightly colored, daisy-like flowers come in an astounding variety of shapes and colors. The plants perform best in poor, well drained soils, particularly in winter. They may be short lived in our heavy clay soils, but are worthy of a place in the garden for their monthslong bloom period. Dividing blanket

flowers every 2-3 years will help to keep them vigorous.



PEROVSKIA OR RUSSIAN SAGE

The silvery, aromatic foliage of all varieties of Perovskia make them resistant to deer and rabbits as well as drought tolerant. Many of the newer varieties are more compact than the standard species so they won't overstep their welcome in your garden. Plant with sedums or grasses

for a beautiful fall combination.



SEDUM

These plants are our #1 drought-tolerant perennial pick. Besides being able to handle dry conditions They grow in so many different shapes and sizes. From the taller upright sedum to the low growing groundcover varieties, you can't beat them.

A perennial garden favorite, coneflowers are dependable and showy. These plants are wonderful for the border and for naturalizing. They have daisy-like flowers with a raised cone and sometimes drooping petals. The seed heads are excellent for dried flower arrangements and are an important food source for songbirds. For best results, plant in well-drained soil and give them space to grow. Echinaceas do not like to be crowded.

A Safer Naper — Back to School SAFETY

THE NAPERVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT ASKS THAT YOU MAKE BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY A PRIORITY. BEFORE THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL BE SURE TO TALK TO YOUR STUDENTS CONCERNING THE FOLLOWING...

Help your child practice it so
they have it memorized before
school begins.

Use the buddy system. Always walk to and from school with a friend or stay with a group at the bus stop. There is safety in numbers. If riding the bus, visit the bus

stop with your child and be sure they know their bus number.

- Walk/ride in well lit areas and never take shortcuts. Instruct children to avoid places they cannot be seen or heard and to stay on the safe routes to school.
- Before the first day of school, walk to and from school with your child.
- Stay within the crosswalks and obey all traffic signals/signs. Obey the crossing guard, if one is available. If children ride their bikes to school, make sure they wear a helmet.
- Teach children the safety rule, "Say NO, GO and TELL". If anyone approaches your child, offers them a ride, asks for directions, or makes them feel uncomfortable, instruct them to say "NO", get away from the situation (GO), and TELL a trusted adult. Be sure to discuss with your child who trusted adults may be: teachers, parents, friend's parents, neighbors, police officers, firefighters, relatives, etc.
- Make sure children understand NEVER to leave school with anyone they haven't been instructed to leave with by you. If someone comes up to them and tells them that there is an emergency and they want your child to go with them, be sure they know to check first with you or another trusted adult (school personnel) before doing so.
- If your students will be taking care of themselves after school, find helpful tips and additional safety rules for them to follow.

SAFETY TIPS FOR MOTORISTS

Children will once again be walking to school through neighborhoods, waiting at bus stops and being dropped off at schools by parents and buses. Motorists can assist with keeping children safe when headed back-to-school by following these tips:

- Plan ahead and leave home earlier than normal to allow enough time to reach your destination without rushing.
- Always come to a complete stop at stop signs, and be sure to check carefully for children on sidewalks and in crosswalks before proceeding. Be sure to obey crossing guards and student safety patrols.
- Slow Down! Remember, school speed zones are reduced for a reason. When entering a school zone, slow down to 20 mph and be extra alert for children on foot and on bicycles.
- Being cautious when approaching school buses. It is illegal to proceed around a school bus with the stop sign arm engaged.

Please be patient as children enter and exit school buses.

- Eliminate distractions. Leave time in the morning to eat and groom before entering your vehicle and stay off the phone while driving. As a reminder, Illinois bans the use of all hand-held devices while driving in Illinois as well as texting while driving.
- Follow each school's traffic and parking plans and signage. If you have questions or want more information on your school's traffic and parking plan, please contact your school.
- Talk to your teen. According to AAA, nearly one in four fatal crashes involving teen drivers occurs during the after-school hours of 3 to 7 pm. Remind them to slow down, reduce distractions and be aware of their surroundings.

SCHOOL CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

- Always lock your locker. Never preset the combination to the last number for easy entry, or "jimmie" it so it stays unlocked.
- Keep track of your valuables and secure them in your locker! Do not leave them on top of your locker, on benches, or in a classroom, bathroom or LRC.
- Never share your locker combination with anyone.
- Lock your bike to the bike rack or other stationery object.
- Lock your car, keep the windows closed, and keep valuables out of sight.
- Keep valuables at home. Never bring large amounts of cash to school or wear expensive jewelry.
- Don't bring weapons to school. If you see one, report it to school officials immediately.
- Report suspicious activities to police, school officials, and your parents.
- Tell a teacher, parent, or other trusted adult if you feel unsafe or if someone is bullying or threatening you.
- Remember it's okay to say NO to adults or another student if they ask you to do something you know is wrong or it makes you feel unsafe or uncomfortable.

SAFETY FOR COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS

College Campuses are like small cities within a city, and thus they are not immune to crime. Following the tips below may help you stay safe while on campus.

- Download the campus map to your phone.
- Check your routes ahead of time and act like you know where you are going.
- Learn the safest routes to your classes and buildings, remembering to stay in well-lit and well-traveled areas where you can easily be seen.
- Know where the blue light emergency phone stations are located.
- Visit the Campus Safety Office and sign up for alerts.
- Familiarize yourself with Campus Safety Resources, such as safe walk or safe ride programs.
- Avoid Distractions Keep your head out of your phone and avoid wearing headphones when walking. If using earbuds, keep only one in.



Is there anything more delicious than late summer watermelon, ripened in the hot sun until juicy and fragrant? Not really, and when you find yourself wilting in the late summer heat, a cold watermelon agua fresca or icy watermelon slushie are perfect to help you cool down and relax. Adults and kids alike will love them, and it's easy to add your own spin with extra flavorings or cantaloupe instead of watermelon.

WATERMELON AGUA FRESCA

4 cups cubed seeded watermelon 1/2 cup water 1/2 cup white sugar (or to taste) 1 lime 24 fresh mint leaves



Combine watermelon and water in a blender and puree until smooth. Add sugar to taste. Slice lime into small wedges (you'll need about 8), then place one wedge into each serving glass, along with 3 mint leaves. Crush with a cocktail muddler (a wooden spoon handle also works), then add ice. Pour the agua fresca over the ice, stir, then serve.

WATERMELON SLUSHIE

4 cups cubed seeded ripe watermelon (188 calories)

2 tablespoons sugar (32 calories) 1 tablespoon lime juice (30 calories) About 3 cups ice

Blend the fruit, melon, sugar and juice until liquid. Add ice and continue to blend until the liquid reaches a slushie consistency.

In the whole blend there are about 250 calories.




